













Bodacious Boxwoods

Name	Shape (<i>habit</i>)	Hgt	Wth	Notes to Know
Arctic Emerald	 Upright		8' x 3'	A new hybrid boxwood that maintains its green color through the winter, and responds well to pruning and fertilization.
Franklin's Gem	 Spreading		2' x 3'	A little leaf, dwarf boxwood with emerald green foliage that turns a rich olive color in the winter. Considered to be the hardiest of all the boxwoods.
Gordo	 Oval		4' x 3'	A compact boxwood with a larger, more scalloped leaf, and only needs minimal pruning and maintenance.
Green Gem	 Rounded		2' x 2'	A slow growing, dwarf boxwood with glossy green foliage that holds its color through the winter, and needs no pruning.
Green Ice	 Rounded		3' x 3'	A very hardy boxwood with deep green foliage that maintains its color all winter, and has a blue-green color to the new growth in the spring.



Name	Shape (<i>habit</i>)	Hgt	Wth	Notes to Know
Green Mountain	 pyramidal	4'	3'	A compact boxwood with a large dark green leaf, and will naturally form a pyramidal shape.
Green Velvet	 Rounded	4'	4'	A very hardy boxwood with deep green foliage that maintains its color all winter, and responds well to pruning.
sempervirens 'Suffruticosa'	 Rounded	2'	2.25'	A compact, dwarf boxwood with a dark green leaf, and responds well to pruning. Good for a short, low maintenance, slow growing hedge.
sempervirens 'Varder Valley'	 Spreading	1.5'	3'	A dwarf, American boxwood with blue-green foliage and apple green new growth which gives it a two toned look in the spring.
Winter Gem	 Oval	4'	3'	A very hardy boxwood that maintains its green color all winter, and responds well to pruning.
